User Guide to AMEPPA Locations

Conference: The AMEPPA conference will be held at the *Minaretein Building*, Hamad Bin Khalifa University, Education City, Doha. This is also where your AMEPPA host institution (the College of Public Policy), its classrooms, and its faculty are located. *The best way to travel is to put "Education City Mosque" into your Uber app and/or tell your taxi driver to take you to the "Education City Mosque"*. The Minaretein Building is the same building as the Education City Mosque. Most drivers (as well as Google Maps) know the building as the Education City Mosque.

<u>Coffee and Tea</u>: Light refreshments are provided to AMEPPA panelists and presenters from 7:30am to 3:30pm on both conference days.

Lunch: Lunch is provided to AMEPPA panelists and presenters in the Atrium.



<u>Gala Dinner</u>: The Gala Dinner for AMEPPA panelists and presenters will be on December 7th at the Al Wadi Hotel, Doha. For our international participants, free transport arranged from the Minaretein Building (Conference Location) to the Al Wadi Hotel.

Tour of Minaretein Building: Tours of this award-winning building will be offered on December 8th at 12:30pm in English and Arabic.

<u>Tour of Doha</u>: On December 8th, a tourism bus will pick up our international panelists presenters at 3:15pm at the Minaretein Building. This tourism service is offered at no charge to such participants.

Biographies of Keynote Speakers

Hamid E. Ali, Ph.D.: Dr. Ali is Dean School of Public Administration and Development Economics at Doha Institute for Graduate Studies. Associate Professor at the American University in Cairo 2008-present. Ali received a M.Sc. in Economics from the University of Texas at Austin in 2000 and a Ph.D. in Economics and Public Policy from the University of Texas in Austin in 2004. He was a researcher at U.S. government Accountability Office (GAO), where he was a major contributor on various reports to U.S. congressional committees. He has been invited to different forums at the U.S. Institute for Peace, the U.S. State Department, and Chatham House. Ali taught at Texas State University and Southern Methodist University.

He is author of books on *Natural Resources, Inequality and Conflict* (Palgrave Macmillan, 2021) with Lars-Erik Cederman; *Institutional Reforms, Governance, and Services Delivery in the Global South* (Palgrave Macmillian, 2021) with Shahjahan Bhuiyan; *Darfur Political Economy: A Quest for Development* (Routledge, 2014) and co-author with Christos Kollias of *Defense Spending, Natural Resources, and Conflict* Routledge (2017). Ali is also the author and co-author of articles in scholarly journals such *Peace Research, Food Policy, Publius: the Journal of Federalism and Defence and Peace Economics*. Ali's primary research interests center around peace economics, economic inequality, defense spending, natural resources, and conflict.



Ghada Barsoum, Ph.D.: Dr. Barsoum, AMEPPA President, is an Associate Professor (with tenure) and the Chair of the Department of Public Policy and Administration at The American University in Cairo (AUC). Barsoum has more than fifty publications including articles in reputable top peer-reviewed journals; technical reports, book chapters, encyclopedia entries, policy papers and a book on women's employment. She writes and teaches on issues pertaining to social policies in the Middle East, gender, higher education, and employment policies. Barsoum has consulted for a number of organizations including the International Labor Organization, UNESCO, UNFPA, UNDP and UNICEF.

Prior to joining AUC, Barsoum was research associate at the Population Council, West Asia and North Africa Office, where she spearheaded efforts for a national survey on youth in Egypt. Barsoum obtained her PhD in Sociology from the University of Toronto and her master's degree from AUC.





Alexander Dawoody, Ph.D.: Dr. Dawoody is the Director of the MPA and Ph.D. Program in Strategic Leadership and Administrative Studies at Marywood University, USA. He is a three-time Fulbright Scholar, and author of several books, journal articles, and scholarly work. He is the Founder of the Association for Middle Eastern Public Policy and Administration (AMEPPA), a professional global scholarly organization recognized by the United Nations Public Administration Network (UNPAN) and its scholarly journal, the Journal of Middle East Review of Public Administration (MEPPA). He is also a founder of the Section on Effective and Sound Administration in the Middle East (SESAME) and the Section on Complexity and Network Studies (CNS) at the American Society for Public Administration (ASPA).

He is also the Founder of the Journal of Applied Professional Studies (which he currently serves as its Editor-in-Chief), and a member of several editorial boards of international scholarly journals. Dr. Dawoody earned his Ph.D. in Public Affairs and Administration from Western Michigan University, and has four master's degrees in philosophy, Education, Health Administration and Public Administration.

He speaks several languages including English, Turkish, Arabic, Farsi, Kurdish, and Spanish. He taught in China, Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, and Honduras, presented in numerous international conferences, and has visited more than 50 countries. Dr. Dawoody is also an artist (oil painting) and a calligrapher.



Clyde Wilcox, Ph.D.: In October 2021, Dr. Wilcox became Interim Dean for Georgetown University in Qatar. Most recently, he was Professor of Government at Georgetown University. He has been a member of the Georgetown faculty since 1987. Dr. Wilcox holds a joint appointment in the Government Department at Georgetown's campus in Washington, DC, and at GU-Q. Since 2014, he has spent all or part of each academic year at the Doha campus. He writes on a variety of topics primarily in American and comparative politics, including religion and politics, gender politics, interest groups and social movements, money in politics, public opinion, electoral behavior, the politics of social issues such as abortion and LGBT rights, and science fiction and politics. He has written or edited more than 30 books and hundreds of book chapters and journal articles. He has lectured in a number of countries, and spoken to international visitors in State Department programs from more than 185 countries. He has consulted with presidential campaigns, with trade associations, and with citizen groups. He has trained diplomats in the US and in other countries.

He is the author or coauthor of God's Warriors: The Christian Right in 20th Century America, Between Two Absolutes: Public Opinion and the Politics of Abortion, Serious Money: Fundraising and Contributing in Presidential Nomination Campaigns, Interest Groups in American Campaigns: The New Face of Electioneering, and Federalism: A Very Short Introduction. He is editor or coeditor of Understanding Public Opinion, The Changing Politics of Gun Control, The Politics of Gay Rights, Religion and Politics in Comparative Perspective: The One, the Few, and the Many, and Political Science Fiction.

Dr. Wilcox holds a B.A. from West Virginia University and an M.A. and Ph.D.
