Prior to his current position, Dr. Umar Oseni was Associate Professor at the Faculty of Law, International Islamic University of Malaysia (IIUM). He was a Visiting Fellow at the Islamic Legal Studies Program of the Harvard Law School in the United States during 2011-2012 to conduct research on Dispute Resolution in Islamic Banking and Finance.

He received his LL.B. (Hons) in Common and Islamic Law from the University of Ilorin, Nigeria; Master of Comparative Laws (with Distinction), and PhD from IIUM. He was a resource person on Islamic microfinance at the UN-Habitat Workshop on Land Development in Islam, was appointed as the Special Officer to the Rector of IIUM, and was also a council member of the International Centre for Waqf Research, IIUM.
